19.04	MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting held on 22 November 2018 were approved and signed as a true and accurate record.	
19.05	TO RECEIVE THE COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT Cllr Lindsay reported as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In November 2018 Suffolk County Council (SCC) announced its intention to cut all funding for Suffolk's Citizen Advice services as part of budget savings, subsequently amended to a phased cut over 2 years – a reduction of 50% (£184k) in each year. A public equalities impact consultation has been run on the proposal, which closed on 23 January. • On 6 December 2018 a motion calling on SCC to do more to tackle single-use plastic waste was agreed unanimously. The measures include a commitment to work towards using only sustainable or re-useable plastics in all Council buildings, communicating with the public on how to reduce plastic waste, 	

	<p>and creating a “plastic free Suffolk network” of councils, businesses and other organisations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A motion at the same meeting however, asking SCC to set an annual “carbon budget” and create targets for reducing carbon emissions was rejected. • SCC has now appointed a new Head of Growth, Highways and Infrastructure and the appointee will start in February. • SCC’s Cabinet will next week consider a report from a Cross-Party Policy Development Panel, recommending that the Council invests £45m in building three new special needs schools and another 36 specialist units within mainstream schools, which together will create 828 new places for children with special educational needs. Such children will then be able to have their needs catered for in-county, rather than have to be sent (as often happens at present) to board in other parts of the country. • SCC has finally dropped plans to build a new Orwell crossing in central Ipswich, after already spending £8.3m. The plan for two smaller bridges to connect Wet Dock Island to the Waterfront will go ahead at a cost of £10m. 	
<p>19.06</p>	<p>TO RECEIVE THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR’S REPORT Cllr Arthey reported as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2019/20 Budget - Work is at an advanced stage, with a likely 3% increase in Babergh’s element of the Council Tax (less than 10% of the total Council Tax bill). • Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) – In the first round of bids for Regulation 123 funds only £65k was spent, with the remaining £316k carried forward to the October 2018 bid round (with over £600k available). Bids included proposals for electric vehicle charging points in Lavenham. Unspent funds will be carried forward to the next bid round in May 2019. • Local Plan – The next round of consultation on the new Local Plan will now take place in the summer of 2019. This will then be followed by the preparation of the submission version and technical consultation before the examination in public takes place. Adoption will not be before 2020. • Waste and recycling – There has been a slight reduction in blue bin recyclables collected. Although electricity is generated from residual waste, it is less profitable than blue bin recycling. Therefore the message is that residents should continue to present the blue bins with all recyclable items clean, dry and loose. • District and Parish elections – These take place on 2 May. The District elections will be based on the new Wards, with Brent Eleigh in the new Box Vale Ward, grouped with Boxford, Edwardstone, Milden and Monks Eleigh. • Brent Eleigh Conservation Area – The updated Conservation Area Appraisal is expected to be completed in the summer of 2019.

Options considered were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To keep the total precept the same i.e. £2,150.00 This would result in a decrease in band D equivalent contributions of approximately £4. • To keep the existing Band D payment the same, which would result in a precept of £2,263.95. • To apply Option 2 and increase in line with the consumer price index level of inflation (currently 2.1%) which would give a precept of £2,311.49. <p>Following discussion it was RESOLVED to seek a precept of £2,250 for 2019/20 (which is a decrease of 0.63% for Band D from 2018/19). As far as parish elections are concerned, the election notices will be issued between 12 and 26 March. 4pm on 3 April will be the deadline for delivery (by hand) of nomination papers. From the date on which the election notice is issued until 10pm on election day - the moratorium period – the existing Council should avoid doing or saying anything that could amount to an infringement of the Code of Recommended Practice on Local Authority publicity.
